As you read through these scholarships, you will notice that several are identified as C & E scholarships. The Citizenship and Education Foundation of the Berlin-Milan Schools is a non-profit corporation established in 1988. The foundation is governed by a board of trustees from the community. The purpose of the foundation is to enrich and enhance educational opportunities by: creating opportunities for special and advanced study, endow programs in support of the curriculum, help sustain this community's tradition of excellence of learning, and offer scholarship aid. The C & E Foundation facilitates young people through four initiatives: 1) a scholarship program that helps students pay tuition to colleges, universities, and technical schools; 2) a grant program which supports teacher and student initiated projects and programs; 3) an endowment fund which facilitates educational programs and community projects; and 4) a special support fund which enables students to participate in special camps and exchange program.

MIKE & MELODIE ADELMAN SCHOLARSHIP - The recipient must meet the following criteria:

- a. Must be a resident of Huron County;
- b. Participation in community service and school activities;
- c. Scholarship may be used for any accredited post-secondary education;
- d. Must provide a summary as to what the student plans to study and why;
- e. Recipient must verify enrollment in a post-secondary school during the second term the first year.

ALUMNI LEADERSHIP AWARD - This award is sponsored by Michael and Yvonne Pannucci, to recognize an Edison senior who has demonstrated leadership and achievement during high school. Financial need will not be a factor. The following criteria will be used for the candidate selection:

- a. Be an active participant in student government, either as a member of student council or a class officer;
- b. Receive two letters in organized athletics (includes cheerleading);
- c. Must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.25; membership in National Honor Society is recommended, but not required;
- d. Before award is given, the winner has two options. Option 1 - Recipient must submit official grade transcript from first term and official schedule for second term to Edison High School who will then present the documents to the sponsor. Option 2 - The sponsor will directly deposit the award with the college the student is attending. The student would notify the registrar's office to release his/her first term grades, as well as a copy of the following semester's class schedule to the sponsor. Either option must be completed by January 15th of the year following your graduation from Edison High School.

AMERICAN RED CROSS SCHOLARSHIP - The American Red Cross awards a scholarship to area high schools that are able to achieve their donation goal at scheduled blood drives. Student Council coordinates the drive on behalf of the Red Cross and administers this award for the organization. This award is given to a student who has actively worked to increase the success of Edison High School's yearly blood drives.

ART CLUB AWARD - This award is presented to a student who has shown outstanding ability in art and a personal fulfillment through art. The recipient must plan to major in an art field at a college or art institute. Must show grade transcript from the first term at college before award is given.

BAND COUNCIL AWARD - Money for the Band Council award has been accumulated through many fundraising events sponsored and worked on by band council members. This award is intended to be used by a student who will major or minor in music in college next year or be performing in a collegiate music ensemble. This student should have demonstrated throughout his / her four years at Edison excellent participating in band and / or choir, as well as involvement in many extra music activities such as solo and ensemble context, show choir, stage band, pep band, pit orchestra and musicals, etc. His / her overall contribution to the music program can also be a consideration for this award.

RICK BASTIEN AWARD (C & E) - This award was founded to ensure a lasting memorial to an outstanding young man, honor student, leader and athlete who lost his life to cancer in 1991. Rick was a 1989 honor graduate of Edison and a student at The College of Wooster. One of Rick's favorite activities was golf. The C&E Foundation is a non-profit organization which benefits the educational program of Berlin-Milan students.

BERLIN GRANGE AWARD (C & E) - This award was established by the former Berlin Grange. It is awarded to an Edison senior who will be continuing his/her education in a two-year or four-year program. The following guidelines apply:

- a. Planning a career in an agricultural service;
- b. Must be of high moral character;
- c. Must have a 2.5 GPA or higher;
- d. Consideration given to financial need.

BERLIN HEIGHTS KIWANIS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP AWARD - This scholarship is awarded to a senior of Edison High School who has shown dedication to service to community, family, church and school. The following guidelines apply:

- a. Provide evidence of above criteria;
- b. Have a minimum GPA of 2.5;
- c. Financial need will be a consideration.

BMTA AWARD - This award is given to a student planning a career in the field of education or social services. Sponsored by the Berlin-Milan Teachers' Association, this award will be given to a student who has demonstrated superior scholarship and seriousness of purpose throughout high school.

BERLIN PARENTS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This award is given to a student who attended Berlin Elementary for at least one year. The scholarship will be awarded after completion of their first semester of college.

MARILYN D. BICKLEY SCHOLARSHIP AWARD (C & E) - This award is given in fond memory of Marilyn D. Bickley, a well-respected teacher at Milan Elementary.

CARMEL JEAN & CARL J. BOEHLER COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP FUND (C & E) - This scholarship will be awarded annually to qualified candidates who are actively and continuously pursuing a baccalaureate degree from an accredited four-year college or university. This award will be given to a student who has demonstrated hard work and diligence both in school and in personal endeavors. Financial need is a consideration.

ARTHUR BUCHWALD SCOUTING SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship was established in memory of Arthur Buchwald who devoted over 50 years to boy scouting and was instrumental in bringing Boy Scouts to the Berlin Heights area. The following guidelines apply:

- a. Needs to be a Life Scout in good standing at time of graduation;
- b. Considering based on scout merit;
- c. Must have a high school GPA of 2.0 or higher;
- d. Applicants must write an essay (250 words or less) on how scouting will affect their future;
- e. The scholarship is awarded after successful completion of one semester of college or technical school training. The recipient of this award must submit their report card to show they are in good standing and then the award is given to them for their second semester.

CHOIR COUNCIL AWARD - Money for the Choir Council Award has been accumulated through many fundraising events sponsored and worked on by choir council members. This award is intended to be used by a student who will major or minor in music in college next year or be performing in a collegiate music ensemble. This student should have demonstrated throughout his or her four years at Edison excellent participating in band and/or choir as well as involvement in many extra music activities such as solo & ensemble contest, show choir, stage band, pep band, pit orchestra and musicals, etc. His or her overall contribution to the music program can also be a consideration for this award.

THE COLLINGWOOD FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship is offered by the Collingwood Family to be awarded to a graduating senior at Edison High School. The scholarship will be awarded in two increments, \$500 for the first term of school and \$500 for the second term, provided the student achieve a 2.5 GPA the first term. Other requirements are:

- a. Must be accepted by an accredited college or university;
- b. Must have a high school GPA of at least 2.5;
- c. Demonstrate extracurricular involvement;
- d. Be of high moral character;
- e. Consideration given to financial need.

DONNA COLWELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This annual award was established in loving memory of Donna Colwell, a dedicated individual in the field of education. This award will be given to a student who exemplifies strong characteristics and enthusiasm to pursue a career in the field of elementary education. This award is given by the Colwell family. The following requirements are:

- a. Must be a senior at Edison participating in competitive athletics;
- b. Must be planning a career in elementary education;
- c. Must meet academic qualifications for college acceptance;
- d. Must demonstrate enthusiasm for learning and service;
- e. Must complete one full semester of college or forfeit the award.

THE DAY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship is offered by the Day family to be awarded to a graduating senior at Edison High School. Other requirements are:

- a. Consideration given to financial need;
- b. Must be active outside of school (i.e. church, scouts, extra-curricular, community involvement).

DEEHR AWARD (C & E) - This award is given by the Deehr family in memory of Carl, Roy, Harrold and Robert Deehr, and all graduates of Berlin Heights High School. Scholarship requirements:

- a. Student must be going into an agricultural program, or if not, into a math or science program;
- b. Have a minimum GPA of 2.6

THE DOERNER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship is offered by the Doerner family to be awarded to a graduating senior at Edison High School who is majoring in a field related to fire protection/EMT services or an electrical trade. Other requirements are:

- a. Scholarship will be awarded upon proof of acceptance by an accredited college or university;
- b. Consideration given to financial need.

DRAMA BOOSTERS AWARD - This award is presented to a student who has made a significant contribution to the Edison Drama program. Preference is given to students who will major or minor in performing arts. This award will be presented at the beginning of the fall semester of the student's sophomore year.

EDISON ATHLETIC BOOSTERS - The Edison Athletic Boosters will present six awards to three boys and three girls who have demonstrated outstanding leadership in athletics. The requirements are:

- a. The student's parents or guardians must have been Athletic Booster members 3 out of 4 years;
- b. Student must have earned at least two varsity letters;
- c. Have a minimum GPA of 2.50 (cumulative - 7th semester);
- d. Be accepted into an associate or baccalaureate degree program at an accredited college, university or technical college;
- e. Attend entire senior year at Edison High School;
- f. Provide evidence of leadership.

EDISON ATHLETIC BOOSTERS VOLUNTEER SCHOLARSHIP - The Edison Athletic Boosters will present a number of scholarships to students whose families have contributed significant volunteer time for the betterment of Edison athletics. The requirements are.

- a. The student's parents must have been EHS Athletic Booster members 3 out of 4 years;
- b. The student's parents must have been a bingo volunteer for 3 out of 4 years, and/or contributed significant volunteer time for the betterment of Edison athletics;
- c. Students must have earned at least 2 varsity letters;
- d. Have a minimum GPA of 2/5 (cumulative - 7th semester);
- e. Be accepted into an associate or baccalaureate degree program at an accredited college, university or technical college;
- f. Attend entire senior year at Edison High School;
- g. Provide evidence of leadership.

EDISON SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship is awarded to a senior who has been accepted into a post secondary school. The source of the funds was generated by the late Sidney Frohman of Sandusky, former president and board chairman of the Hinde & Dauch Paper Company which he ran for many years. His success as a business leader in the community led to his principal of sharing that success with others in Erie County. Other requirements are:

- a. The student must exhibit outstanding citizenship;
- b. Participation in school activities;
- c. Possess acceptable scholarship standards.

FRENCH CLUB SCHOLARSHIP AWARD - The French Club will present one award to a senior who has been accepted to a two-year or four-year college university. To qualify for this award, the recipient must meet the following requirements:

- a. Must have studied a minimum of three years of high school French;
- b. Must be a member of the French Honor Society;
- c. Must have been an active member of French Club for a minimum of two years;
- d. Must complete a 250 word essay in English stating what you'd like to do with the French you now know (please write your name at the bottom of the page).

NICK GEORGIAFANDIS SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship is sponsored by the Georgiafandis family. Nick Georgiafandis was the music director at Edison High School from 1971 to 2007. During this time, he was the conductor of the high school marching and concert bands as well as the concert choir. He also instructed courses in music history, theory and advanced music theory. In addition, Mr. Georgiafandis also conducted the stage band, pep band and in 1979 began conducting the Sound Dimension Show Choir. He was also the music director for over 30 high school musical productions where he instructed the vocalists and conducted the pit orchestra. To qualify for this award, the recipient must meet the following requirements:

- a. Must have been a member in good standing in high school band and/or choir for 4 years;
- b. Must be planning to continue music studies in college as either a major or minor (BA / BS) in any of the various options available: music theater, music education, performance, therapy, composition, engineering, etc.;
- c. Must have been involved in at least one of the high school music satellite groups including stage band, show choir, pep band, pit orchestra or musical all four years of high school;
- d. Must have competed in high school solo and/or ensemble competitions all four years;
- e. Should have (not mandatory) participated in at least two honors type or all-star bands or choirs during the four years of high school.

DON GFELL AWARD (C & E) - This award is sponsored by Don Gfell, former Superintendent of Berlin-Milan Local Schools. The C & E Foundation is a non-profit organization which benefits the educational program of Berlin-Milan students.

MATTHEW T. GFELL AWARD (C & E) - This award was established by family and friends in loving memory of Matt. He lost his life in an ultralight plane accident in 2004. Matt was a 1990 graduate of Edison High School. He was a member of the varsity golf team. Matt attended college for two years before enlisting in the U.S. Air Force where he served 7-1/2 years. He was a Staff Sergeant, specializing in avionics, fiber-optics and ground radio communications. This award may be used for a two or four year college or technical program.

MARIE MATTEO GUILFOYLE SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - Marie Matteo Guilfoyle was born in Summit, NJ (25 miles west of New York City) the oldest of three children. She was a firm believer in higher education for everyone and was the first in her family to further her education beyond high school. She attended the Berkley Secretarial School outside of New York City and became a secretary to the chairman of the Hoffman Beverage Company in Newark, NJ. She became a wife and mother of two children. She was a pioneer for the female workforce when she returned to the business world after staying at home with her children for twelve years. Not many women had a career and children at that time. Marie became employed and was an administrative assistant at the Summit Bancorp in Chatham, NJ for thirty years. During those years, she mentored many young women into the business world, encouraging them to put their "foot forward" and express their views. She was an advocate for women promoting themselves at the workplace. Also, Marie funded and supported many students through college, vocational school and business school. She was always willing to help children reach their life-long goals and she continues to do so through this scholarship. Criteria for this scholarship:

- a. 3.0 GPA or higher
- b. Participation in extracurricular activities
- c. Demonstrate leadership

ROCH A. HAMMOND, JR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - This scholarship is sponsored by Roch's family and friends to honor the memory of this outstanding young man. Roch graduated from Edison High School in 2001 and from The Ohio State University, Cum Laude, in 2005 with a Bachelor of Arts degree from OSU's prestigious Political Science program. Roch began his interest in journalism in high school and was a Quill and Scroll member. While in college, Roch co-founded *The OSU Sentinel* newspaper in 2003 and was their executive editor and contributing writer. Roch also was a summer intern in 2004 for CNS News in Alexandria, VA/Washington DC. Roch was passionate about sports, life, fun, family, friends, politics and was a gifted journalist. Roch lost his life April 2, 2006 in a motor vehicle accident. Recipients of this scholarship will be selected based on the following criteria:

- a. Must be able to verify acceptance to a college or university. Special consideration given to acceptance verification to The Ohio State University;
- b. Must be planning a career in journalism, politics or related fields;
- c. Consideration given to financial need;
- d. Must complete an essay (250 words or less) demonstrating their passion for journalism, sports or politics;
- e. The scholarship will be awarded after successful completion of one quarter or semester of college. The recipient of this award must submit their report card to the sponsor to show that they are in good standing and then the award will be given for their second quarter or semester.

HARRIS-BURNESON HEALTH CARE AWARD (C & E) - This award was established by Don and Marjorie Burneson to honor Agnes Ireland Harris, Mrs. Burneson's mother, who came to Milan in 1965 and remained until her death in 1974. Mrs. Harris had reason to know and appreciate the dedication of many fine nurses during her lifetime and considered nursing to be one of the most admirable professions. To qualify, the recipient must meet the following standards:

- a. Senior at Edison High School;
- b. Superior citizen and leader;
- c. Outstanding scholar;
- d. High moral character;
- e. Attend an accredited school of nursing or four-year college majoring in a health care field, preference is given to nursing majors, but pre-med, physical therapy, or other health careers will be considered;
- f. Evidence of initiative and commitment to a career in nursing or health care;
- g. Financial need considered.

MATTHEW HEID MEMORIAL AWARD (C & E) - This annual award was established in loving memory of Matthew Heid, a member of the Edison class of 1995. Matt was an "all American kid" who played on the varsity baseball and golf teams. He was an outstanding young man who had been accepted by Kent State University and was looking forward to the challenge of college. His life was cut short by a tragic automobile accident just eighteen days after graduation. Recipients of this scholarship will be selected on the following guidelines:

- a. Senior at Edison high School;
- b. Be of high moral character exemplified by qualities of outstanding leadership, honesty and courage;
- c. Accepted in an associate or baccalaureate degree program at a college, university or technical school;
- d. Have one personal letter of recommendation from someone other than a relative, teacher or administrator of Berlin-Milan School (i.e. minister / priest, club advisor or employer);
- e. Primary determination will not be based on financial need or GPA;
- f. Award must be used in two semesters or three quarters, or will be awarded to another applicant;
- g. Must complete one full year of college or forfeit award;
- h. Personal interview may be required.

GLEN HENNINGS AWARD (C & E) - This award is a lasting memorial to Mr. Hennings. He was an engineer with NASA (National Air and Space Administration) Rocket Division from 1954 until his retirement. Mr. Hennings was a member of the Berlin-Milan Board of Education until 1986. Being a member of the Milan Rotary gave him the opportunity to help the community many other ways. To qualify for this award, recipients must meet the following requirements:

- a. A graduating senior of Edison High School and accepted by an accredited college or University;
- b. Have a minimum GPA of 3.5;
- c. Plan a career in aerospace field;
- d. Financial need is also considered.

PEARL JENNER AWARD (C & E) - This award is given in fond memory of Pearl Jenner, a well-respected teacher at Milan Elementary for many years. The following guidelines apply:

- a. Be a graduating senior of Edison High School accepted by an accredited college or University;
- b. Demonstrate excellent scholarship;
- c. Plan a career in the field of education;
- d. Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher;
- e. Be of high moral character.

JIM'S PIZZA BOX AWARD - This award will be given to a student who exemplifies strong character, shows academic aptitude and leadership qualities. The winner will receive the check after the end of the first term at college.

TROY JOHNSON MEMORIAL AWARD (C & E) - This award was founded to ensure a lasting memorial to an outstanding young man, student leader, athlete, member of the choir and a well-rounded student who lost his life in a car-train accident in 1984. Recipients of this scholarship will be selected on the following guidelines:

- a. Must be a senior at Edison High School;
- b. Must meet academic qualifications for college acceptance (generally a 2.5 GPA or higher);
- c. Must be of high moral character;
- d. Must demonstrate enthusiasm for learning and service;
- e. Decision may also be based on financial need.

LORI LINDECAMP MEMORIAL PERFORMING ARTS AWARD (C & E) - This award was founded to ensure a lasting memorial to an outstanding young lady, honor student, leader, athlete, performing artist and well-rounded student who lost her life in a highway accident in 1983. Recipients of this award will be selected on the following guidelines:

- a. Must be a senior at Edison, participating in the performing arts;
- b. Must meet academic qualifications for college acceptance (generally a 2.5 GPA or higher);
- c. Must be of high moral character;
- d. Must demonstrate enthusiasm for learning and service;
- e. Decision may also be based on financial need.

GEROULD R. & SARAH H. McWANE SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - The purpose of this scholarship is to financially assist students attending a college or technical school. The recipient of this award must be senior graduating from Edison High School who has attended Edison for at least two academic years. Selection will be based on academic potential, financial need and a submitted essay. Students submitting the application may be interviewed by a committee of five peers and one faculty member. This scholarship has an additional application which is the last page of the application packet and needs to be turned in separately by the same deadline. All items must be completed in order to qualify for this scholarship.

MILAN AMERICAN LEGION / COLVIN-DALE POST 527 AWARD - This award will be given to a student who exemplifies strong character, academic aptitude (minimum 2.0 GPA) and shows leadership qualities.

MILAN EDISON LIONS AWARD (C & E) - This award is presented to an Edison senior who exhibits superior scholarship and seriousness of purpose, citizenship, leadership, financial need, character, and has attended Edison High School and their entire senior year.

MILAN JAYCEES - THE JEFF SPRADLIN AWARD - The recipient of this award must be an outstanding athlete. Student must be active in sports as well as other organizations and have been accepted at a college.

MILAN MELON FESTIVAL AWARD - There will be three awards given annually. Recipients must be members of the Varsity "E" Club. The money is raised by the Varsity "E" Club during the Sport-a-Thon each year at the Melon Festival.

MILAN ROTARY AWARD - This award is given to an Edison High School senior accepted by a two-year or four-year college, showing qualities of leadership, character, scholarship, service and financial need.

SALLY A. MORRISON SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This award is sponsored by Mrs. Gerald Morrison. Sally Morrison is a retired teacher from Berlin-Milan Schools. Financial need is a consideration.

CHARLES & MARGARET NICKELS AWARD (C & E) - The Nickels Award was established in 1991 in memory of Mr. and Mrs. Nickels by their daughters. Mr. Nickels was a graduate of Milan High and a successful farmer in the area. The Nickels Award was established in recognition of Mr. and Mrs. Nickels' belief in and support for education. The recipient of this award must be attending a four-year college majoring in agriculture, land management or environmental sciences. Applicant should include evidence of initiative, imagination and innovation which he / she hopes to apply to their chosen field of study.

RUSSELL & RUTH NICKELS AWARD (C & E) - This award, established in 2009, is in memory of Russell & Ruth Nickels by their sons. Mr. & Mrs. Nickels were lifetime residents and farmers in the area. The following criteria will be used in selecting the recipient(s):

- a. Must have attending Edison/EHOVE for entire senior year;
- b. Must have a 2.5 or higher gpa for during junior year and first semester of senior year;
- c. Must plan to attend an Ohio accredited institution of post high school learning;
- d. Must complete the essay on goals - page five of the scholarship application;
- e. Must work a minimum of 10 hours a week during the first semester/quarter of college;
- f. Award will be given upon successful completion of first semester/quarter (2.0 gpa) along with a copy of official transcript for the first term, copy of work pay stubs for a minimum of two months during the first term and enrollment verification for second;
- g. Financial need may be considered;
- h. An interview may be required.

NORTHERN OHIO SURGICAL CENTER HEALTHCARE AWARD - The Northern Ohio Surgical Center is a multi-specialty ambulatory surgery center that opened its doors in August of 2000. The mission is to provide the highest quality patient care services using state of the art technology in an environment that focuses on warmth and compassion while remaining cost effective. The Board of Managers believes that not only do they need to care for patients currently, but to help future healthcare professionals. Therefore, the Northern Ohio Surgical Center is establishing a scholarship for a graduating senior that is going into the healthcare field.

OAPSE CHAPTER 350 AWARD - The winner of this/these award(s) must complete a semester or quarter of college before collecting the scholarship. This award will be given to a child of an OAPSE (Ohio Association of Public Service Employees) member.

KEITH OSTHEIMER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - This award is a lasting memorial to Keith Ostheimer who was the founder of the Berlin-Milan Youth Sports league (BMYSL). Keith was an active member of the board from 2000 until his time of death in 2006. Keith was a 1978 Edison High School graduate. He was a member of the Edison football, basketball and track teams from 1974 - 1978. Keith's goal for BMYSL was to offer the children of the Berlin-Milan school district as many opportunities to experience as many sports as possible during their youth. This scholarship is sponsored and awarded by the Berlin-Milan Youth Sports League. The following criteria will be used for the candidate selection:

- a. GPA of 2.5 or higher
- b. Must have been a participant in a BMYSL sport or activities. List sports played, activities, umpiring, etc. Sports / years BMYSL began: Milan softball and baseball 2000, 6th grade football 2000, cheerleading 2005, soccer 2001, 5th/6th grade boys basketball 2002, 6th grade girls basketball 2006.
- c. Must complete a semester of college or other approved post secondary option in good standing to receive the award.
- d. Must submit a 250 word essay listing your name, sport or activity you participated in along with the year you were involved with each activity. The essay must include one or more the following topics:
 1. Favorite youth coach that may have inspired or touched your life and why.
 2. Favorite youth sports memory or achievement.
 3. How BMYSL sports has impacted your life.

PEACEFUL SOLUTIONS 2009 SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - The Class of 2009 felt fortunate to receive an education in a peaceful environment. Their hope is that this scholarship will encourage students to find creative solutions to the growing problem of violence in schools. The goal is to help insure Edison High School remains a safe harbor. The scholarship selection will be based on an essay (500 word maximum) that describes what he / she has done to curb violence or promote a safer, healthier environment in the school or community. There is no GPA requirement. However, the recipient must plan to enroll in a post-secondary institution. The Peaceful Solutions Scholarship Program was designed and conceived by the Class of 1999. In order to receive this award the recipient must turn in his / her first semester grade card and proof of enrollment / college billing statement for the first or second semester to the Berlin-Milan Treasurer's Office.

RIC POLLACK MEMORIAL AWARD (C & E) - This award is in memory of Ric Pollack. It is awarded to an Edison High School senior pursuing a fine arts education (art, art therapy, photography, fashion design, music or related careers).

RICHARD D. PUSATERI MEMORIAL AWARD (C & E) - This award was founded by Mrs. Joseph Pusateri as a tribute to the youth who served in World War II and to ensure a lasting memorial to her son, Staff Sergeant Richard D. Pusateri. Dick was an outstanding young man who served his country and gave his life during the Battle of the Bulge in 1945. To qualify for this award, recipients must meet the following requirements:

- a. Be a senior at Edison High School;
- b. Meet academic qualifications for college acceptance;
- c. Be of high moral character;
- d. Exemplify American ideals;
- e. Financial need considered.

DAVID A. REER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - This scholarship initiated by members of the Edison High School class of 1971. In appreciation to the class of 1971, the Bob Reer family would like to continue this scholarship yearly. Dave was the class valedictorian and tragically succumbed to cancer within a short time following graduation. It is hoped that the person receiving this scholarship will exhibit the kind of character and spirit of determination that serves all of us, and that David exemplified so well. A committee will review all applications and award this scholarship to the individual they determine as most deserving of this special scholarship. Recipients of this scholarship will be selected based on the following guidelines:

- a. Must attend entire senior year at Edison High School;
- b. Must be of high moral character;
- c. Exhibit leadership qualities;
- d. Should be a non-smoker;
- e. High academic achievement is not a sole determining factor;
- f. Special consideration will be given to those who have overcome a personal handicap or hardship situation (applicants must include a letter explaining their hardship they have overcome);
- g. Must complete a 150-200 word essay describing a personal hardship you've overcome or are going through.

ROE'S TREE SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This scholarship will be awarded to an Edison senior who will be continuing his/her education in a two-year or four-year program (trade school, vocational school or university). Financial need will be a consideration.

DR. RONALD M. RUBLE EDISON HIGH SCHOOL THESPIAN SCHOLARSHIP - This \$700 scholarship award is available to an entering freshman at BGSU Firelands who earned membership in the Edison High School Thespian Troupe. The recipient must register for THEA 139/339 for each semester and additional theatre courses as the student's course schedule permits; work on all plays for each semester either as a performer, or production crew member on painting/construction, or costumes, or properties, or makeup, or lighting (working on publicity and usher crews only is not substantial enough); hold an active membership in Speech Activities Organization-Theatre (SAO-T) each semester unless class schedule conflicts with the organization's meeting time. SAO-T is the student theater club/organization which supports both the Firelands College Theatre program (FCT) and the Caryl Crane Children's Theatre program (CCCT). The recipient must maintain a 2.5 GPA for college level work. Eligible applicants must have earned a "C" average for all high school work. Financial need is a consideration for this scholarship award. In the application, the applicant must speak to (1) the role theater played in their Edison years, and (2) their interest in theater at BGSU Firelands.

C.B. SANDERS AWARD (C & E) - This award is presented by the Berlin Heights Kiwanis Club and has been established to honor the educational excellence of C.B. Sanders, first principal of Edison High School and educator from 1951 - 1986. Students planning to pursue a career in education are eligible for this scholarship. A 100 word essay on the importance of a career in education is required for this scholarship.

SPANISH CLUB AWARD - This award is given to a senior who:

- a. Has completed a minimum of three years of Spanish;
- b. Has maintained a "B" average in Spanish courses;
- c. Has maintained a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0;
- d. Has been a member of Spanish Club for at least two years;
- e. Will be attending a two-year or four-year college or university.

SUHANIC FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP - This scholarship is awarded to a senior who has been accepted into a post secondary school. Other requirements are:

- a. The student must exhibit outstanding citizenship;
- b. Participation in school activities;
- c. Possess acceptable scholarship standards.

GEORGE WEILNAU SCHOLARSHIP (C & E) - This award will be presented to all graduating seniors meeting the following criteria:

- a. Must be a graduating senior from Berlin-Milan school district, having attending their junior and senior years in the system;
- b. Earned a minimum of 2.5 GPA at time of application;
- c. Plan on attending an accredited post-secondary institution in the state of Ohio;
- d. Majors in agriculture and education will be given priority with all other majors considered by scholarship committee;
- e. In order to receive the award the student needs to submit first or subsequent term grades of a 2.0 or higher with a minimum of 12 semester quarter hours, a schedule of classes and a bill for the next term. There is a one year deadline from the date of your high school graduation to submit documentation to the district treasurer.

JEANINE WILLIAMS EDUCATION AWARD (C & E) - This award is established by Jeanine Williams to be presented to a student planning a career in education. The requirements for this award are:

- a. Be a graduating senior of Edison High School and accepted by an accredited college or university;
- b. Demonstrate excellent scholarship;
- c. Has actively participated in extracurricular activities;
- d. Financial need.

JOHN WILLIAMS MEMORIAL AWARD (C & E) - This award was established by the family of John Williams. It is awarded to an Edison senior who will be continuing his/her education in a two-year or four-year program in carpentry or landscape/hardscape construction or building trades such as plumbing, heating or electric. Applicants must show the following:

- a. Have a minimum GPA of 2.5;
- b. Be activity participating in extracurricular activities;
- c. Show financial need.

VALERIA ZALESKI SCHOLARSHIP - This award is given in loving memory of Valeria Zaleski, a generous grandmother with a strong work ethic. This scholarship will be granted to students who demonstrate perseverance by working at a job while pursuing a business degree. The recipient must meet the following criteria:

- a. Pursue a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university in the field of business;
- b. Work a minimum of 10 hours per week during the first college term (semester or quarter);
- c. Submit an essay (300 words or less) addressing the following: "Our nation is facing many economic challenges. In your opinion, what changes need to be considered and who is accountable for the changes that need to take place."
- d. Provide a copy of an official grade transcript from the first college term and copy of work pay stubs for a minimum of two months during the first college term;
- e. Have a minimum high school GPA of 2.5 (cumulative - 7th semester).

The following local scholarships are offered to students enrolling at BGSU - Firelands College in the fall. However, a local scholarship application should NOT be completed for these awards. Information for both scholarships can be obtained through Firelands College.

MILAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE - This scholarship is awarded by Milan Chamber of Commerce to an Edison senior planning to attend Firelands College.

MILAN MOTHER'S CLUB AWARD - This scholarship is awarded to an Edison senior planning to attend Firelands College. Criteria for selection:

- a. At least a "C" average;
- b. Financial need.

The following local scholarship is offered to club members only. A local scholarship application should NOT be completed for this award. Please contact Mrs. Wallrabenstein if interested in applying for this award.

EDISON MATH CLUB AWARD - This award is given to a student who is an active member of the Math Club and is planning a career in a math related field.

The awards listed in this packet are known to be offered as of January 29, 2010. The availability of these scholarships is subject to change based on sponsor request. The monetary amounts of these awards may vary from year to year as does the number of awards given by an organization.

The awards are usually made directly to the student. A few of the organizations will award the check after the student has completed the first quarter or semester and has paid fees for the second semester or quarter. Organizations usually give students written procedures at the time of the award presentation.

All C & E Funds are made available to the student through the Berlin-Milan Treasurer's Office. If the student receives a C & E scholarship, all questions should be directed to Mrs. Nikki Spriggs at 419-499-4652, ext. 1162.
