



Dismissal Procedures

Edison High School Chapter of the National Honor Society

When you were inducted into National Honor Society, you recited a pledge to uphold the ideals of NHS. That pledge carries a responsibility, which is part of the privilege of being a member of NHS. According to the constitution of the National Honor Society, members who fall below the standards, which were the basis for selection, i.e., scholarship, leadership, service, and character, may be considered eligible for dismissal. The dismissal procedure is as followed:

1. Each semester, the advisor of National Honor Society will review each member's cumulative GPA, service hours, activity points, character evaluations, and meeting attendance.
2. If a student has fallen below the standards which were the basis of their selection they will receive a written warning and given a reasonable amount of time to correct the deficiency, if possible.
3. If the issue is not resolved within a set amount of time, the member will be notified of their impending dismissal and given the right to a hearing before the Faculty Council.
4. The Faculty Council will then vote. A majority vote is required for the student to be dismissed. The decision of the faculty council is final, the National Council and the NASSP shall hear no appeals in dismissal cases.
5. Members who resign or are dismissed are never again eligible for membership or its benefits.
